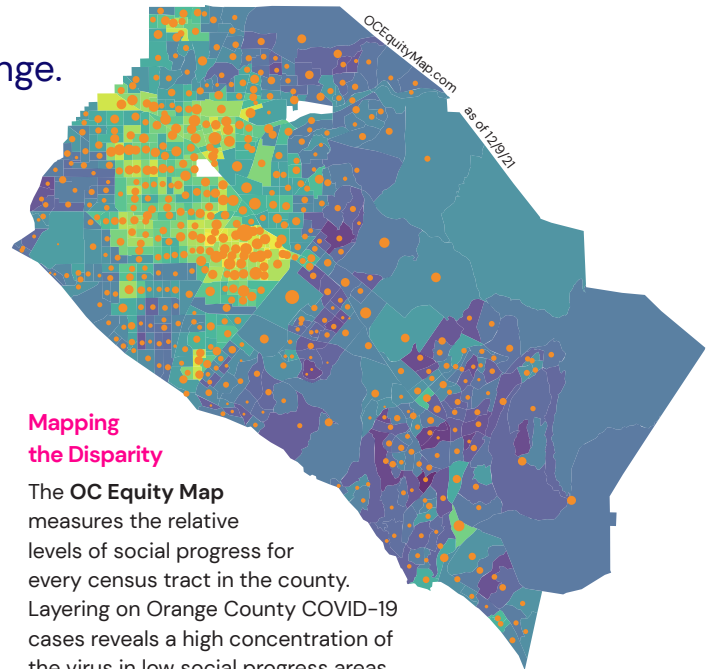
THE CASE FOR EQUITY

The COVID-19 pandemic exposed deep rooted gaps in Orange County (OC) caused by underlying health inequities and disparities.

- Almost 90% of total COVID-19 deaths were adults aged 55 and older, despite being ~28% of the OC population
- Latinos experienced the highest percentage of cases among all races/ethnic group
- During peak months of the pandemic, higher case and death incidence were reported in north/central regions of the county

Orange County at a Glance (2010 Census data)

3.2m residents	8% below poverty	10% uninsured
35% Latino	21% Asian	2% Black



Mapping the Disparity

The OC Equity Map measures the relative levels of social progress for every census tract in the county. Layering on Orange County COVID-19 cases reveals a high concentration of the virus in low social progress areas.

EMBRACING THE OPPORTUNITY

Provided with funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Health Equity grant, we aim to provide quality health for everyone in the OC community. Here's how:

1. Expand existing and/or develop new prevention resources for underserved and underrepresented populations
2. Build, leverage, and expand the capacity and infrastructure of the OC Health Care Agency (HCA) and its partners
3. Increase or improve data collection, reporting, and capability
4. Mobilize partners and collaborators to advance health equity and address **social determinants of health (SDoH)**

Equity in OC Guiding Principles

Along with community partners, the HCA is launching the Equity in OC Initiative with the following guiding principles:

Community and Data Driven Facilitate collaboration with public and private stakeholders to generate collective action	Address SDoH Work with community to identify and prioritize key SDoH action areas
Equitable Participation Make participation possible for all stakeholders, including non-traditional and small groups	Collective Capacity Create capacity across OC and population segments impacted by health inequities
